"You don't need a highend art education to appreciate art, our goal is to help people realize that they are born with everything they need to take the next step into collecting. Furthermore, flying to New York to have a high end cultural experience isn't necessary when it's accessible and happening right here in Grand Rapids."

Loftis added that he has a passion for integrating early and mid-career artists alongside well known names and that he specifically enjoys speaking with those who have had little to no art exposure, which is an idea Collectors Show welcomes.

"As someone who has no background in art, I found Collectors Show to be an ideal atmosphere to stroll, engage and learn about not only the pieces presented but the artists behind them as well. It's a wonderful introduction to art we're not normally able to view," said Jeff Gurney, who has been collecting art for the last five years and has purchased works from past Collectors Show events. "If someone finds themselves intrigued by casually viewing art, it's a show they can visit and not feel any pressure as well as feel welcome to simply ask questions. The minds behind Collectors Show are there to assist and guide those of all backgrounds."

Collectors Show kicks off its fifth installment with an invite-only, first-look VIP premier featuring various guest speakers on September 14. It is followed on September 15 with an art collecting event that is open to the public. All artwork will be at guaranteed reduced pricing in comparison to certified or established gallery pricing.

Guests can expect to view works from roughly 90 artists total including a juried selection of 62 ArtPrize artists, New York Studio School Alumni Show award winners, featured artists from New York City and a various selection of local and national artists selected by Second Ave Arts.
